  - For the Flood Annex participants included: Department of Planning, Department of Public Works, Department of Transportation, and the Office of Emergency Management. During the table top exercise, the group discussed flood related hazards and how the agencies would respond. For the Food and Water table top exercise, participants including staff from Department of Planning, Department of Public Works, The Office of Emergency Management and the Baltimore Metropolitan Council.
