The Shield of Freedom



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Past and Present



- 1790: “Revenue Marine” created within Treasury
- 1863: “Revenue Cutter Service” established
- 1915: Revenue Cutter Service combines with the U.S. Lifesaving Service (1848) to create the Coast Guard
- 1939: U.S. Lighthouse Service (1789) added
- 1946: Steamboat Inspection Service (1838) added
- 1967: Coast Guard moved to Department of Transportation
- 2003: Coast Guard moved to Department of Homeland Security



Coast Guard Roles and Missions

- Maritime Safety – saving lives and protecting property
- Maritime Security – establishing and maintaining a secure maritime system while facilitating its use for the national good
- Maritime Stewardship – managing the sustainable and effective use of its inland, coastal and ocean waters and resources for the future

The Magnuson Act [1950] — Broad authority to control vessel operations

33 USC 1221 to 1236 [1972] —
The Ports and Waterways Safety Act

33 USC 1226 [1986] —
Regulates PWSA Antiterrorism Security Zones

14 USC 1 [1915] — Designates the Coast Guard as a military service

The Espionage Act [1917] — Bestows broad authority to control vessels

14 USC § 91 [1941] — Authorizes Coast Guard powers to ensure the safety or security of any United States naval vessel



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Average Day for the Coast Guard

(2007 Data)

- Saved 14 lives and assisted 98 people in distress
- Interdicted 17 illegal migrants at sea
- Responded to 12 oil/hazardous chemical spills
- Inspected 25 waterfront facilities
- Conducted 78 search and rescue cases
- Seized \$8.4 million worth of illegal drugs
- Boarded 193 ships and boats
- Administered 21 commercial fishing vessel examinations



Coast Guard People



- 40,903 Active Duty
- 7,709 Reservists
- 7,695 Civilians
- 28,500 Auxiliarists
(as of March 2008)



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Sector Baltimore People and Budget
