



Typhoon Haiyan (Yolanda)

- Landfall Nov. 8th, 2013 (morning, EST)
- Sustained winds of 195 mph on land, strongest on record
- Category 5 is 157 mph... category 7?
- 4th strongest storm in history
- Storm surge of 30 feet recorded



Delta Spirit

- Timeline:
 - MOEM contacted on 11/12/13 at 7:30 PM
 - Noon on 11/13/13, receive phone call
 - Flight at 0600 on 11/14/13
- Pre-deployment Info:
 - Small medical group sponsored by Delta Airlines
 - Tents, food, water, and security would be provided
 - Working with Filipino team deploying to Eastern Samar Province

Recruitment

"This is austere, this is disorganized and this is voluntary. That's the bad news. I suggest, indeed strongly urge you to bring your own fully provisioned go kit for a 10 day deployment, this includes full gear for tropical deployment and don't forget your bathing suit, sun screen, mosquito spray, snake kit and steel toed shoes! This organization generally does Critical Incident Stress work and seems to be retooling themselves at the same time they are deploying."

Hero to zero? Noy feels backlash

Two days before one of the world's most powerful typhoons rammed into the Philippines, President Aquino had a simple but ambitious target for all government agencies: zero casualties.





Moving Stuff

- US Navy began ops Nov. 14th
- By the 19th, moved 420,000 liters of water and 290,000 pounds of food
- 20 helicopters delivering to villages
- Aircraft cycling between Manila, Cebu, Tacloban, and Guiuan
- Also witnessed aircraft from Australia, New Zealand, Sweden, Russia, Canada...



New Mission

- Filipino volunteers arrived in the evening
- 3 doctors, 7 nurses, 4 volunteers
- Stockpile of medical supplies
 - Antibiotics
 - Wound care
 - PPE
 - Syringes
 - Antiseptics
 - Antifungals
 - Tetanus toxoid was flown to USS George Washington for refrigeration, coolers for the day
 - Supplies replenished every morning by Alphaland














Current Status


