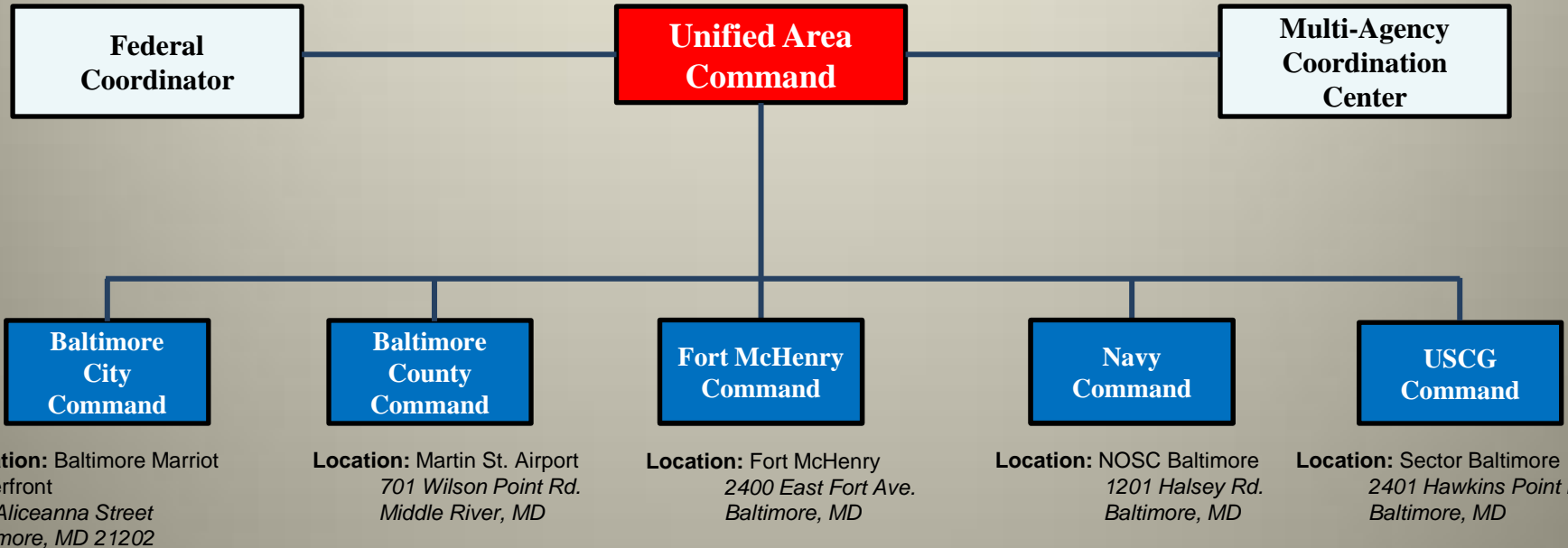

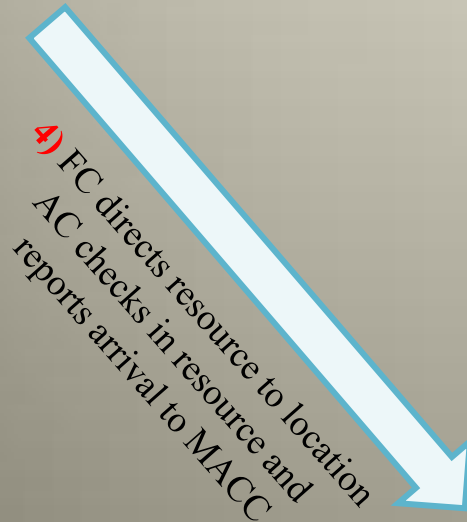

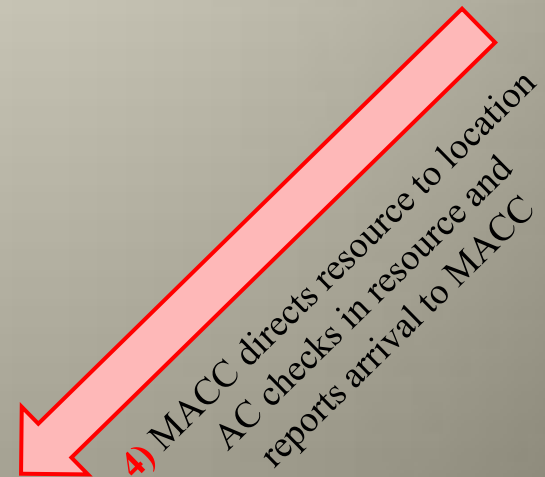

- UAC staff will provide periodic Executive-level briefing reports

 - Homeland Security Information Network (HSIN)
 - Radio
 - Landline and cellular telephones

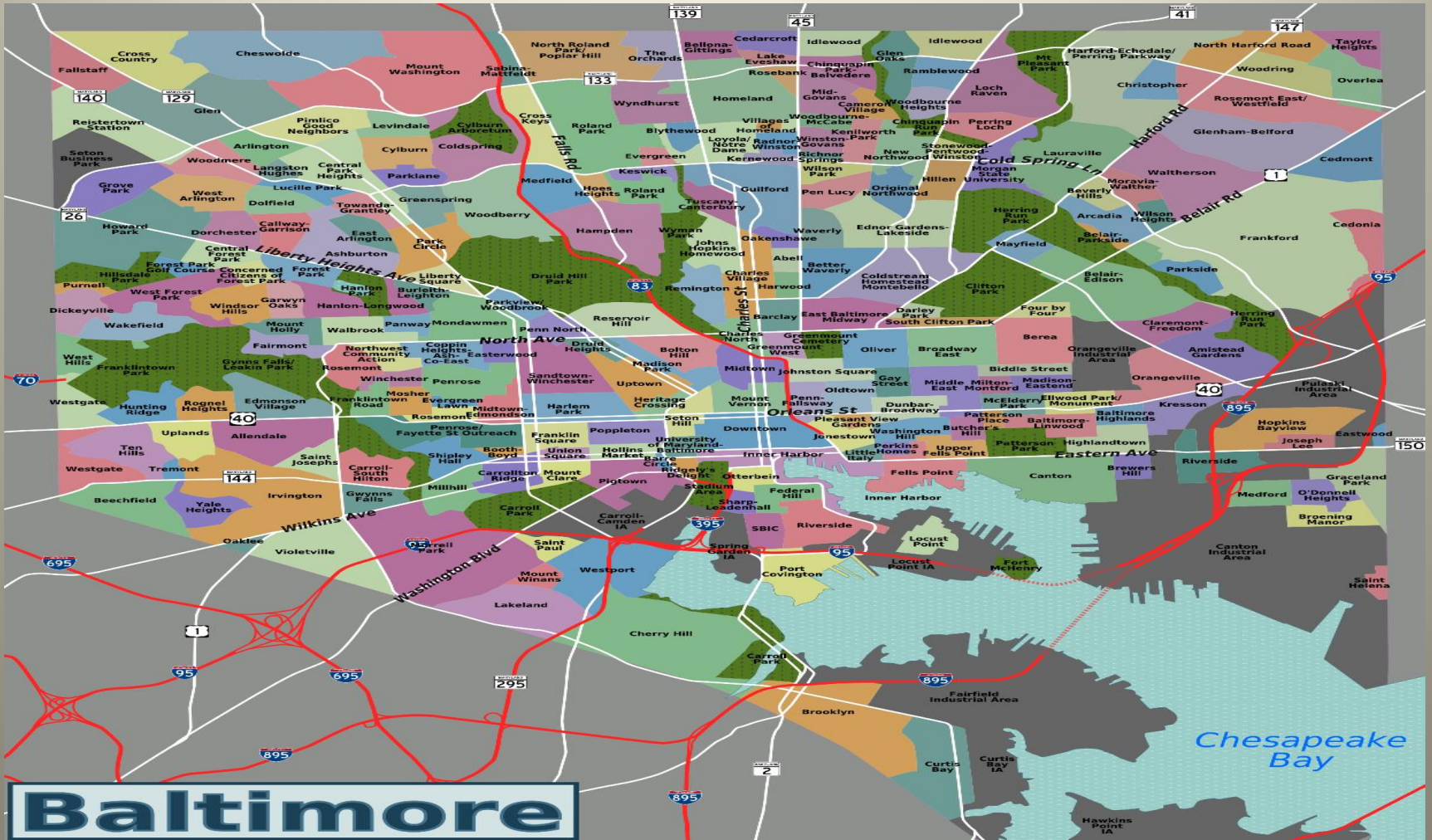

Public Safety Initiative Model

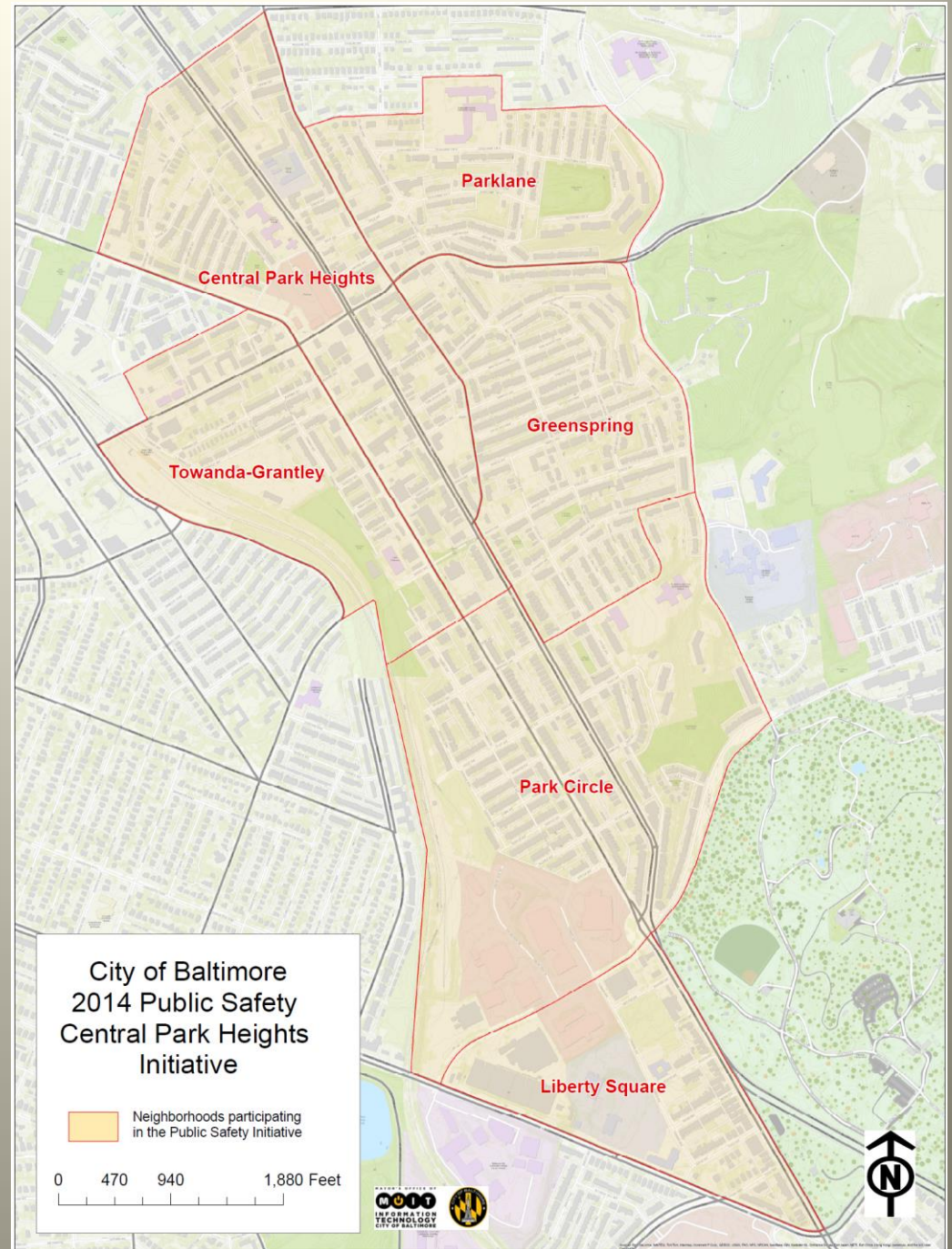
- Community Engagement

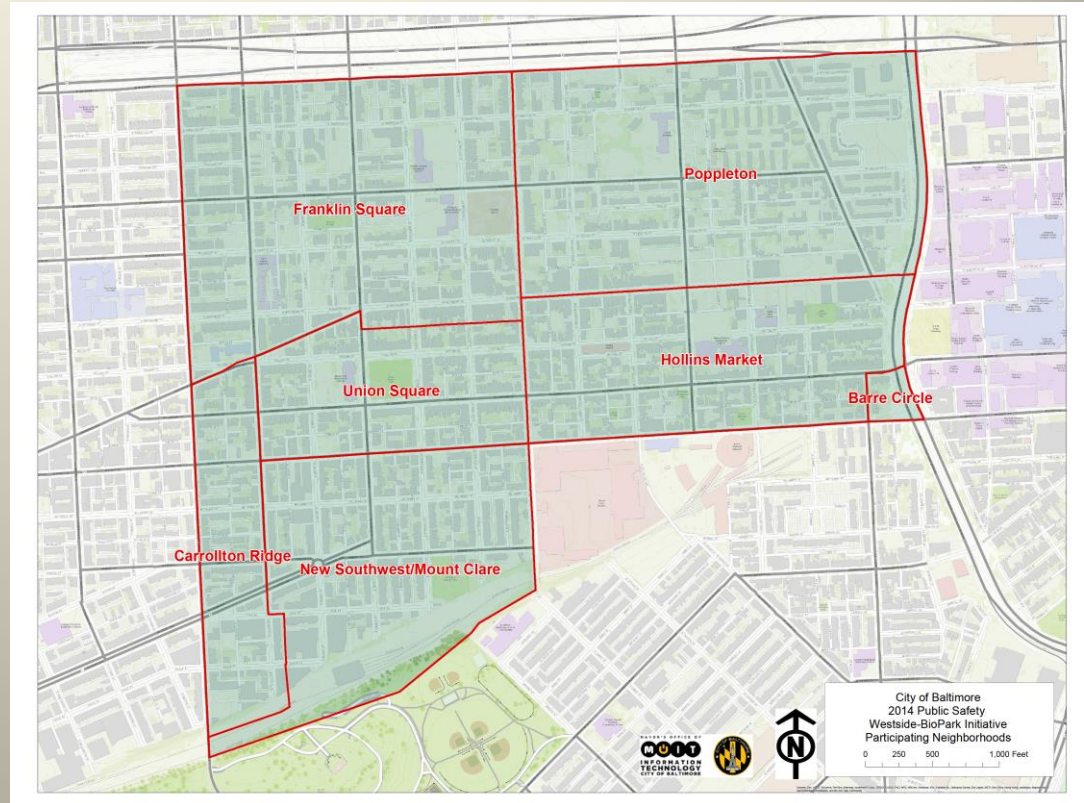
